Class Book Ideas

1. “If I Were a Flower, Which One Would I Be?”

Provide the children with pages that have the sentence, “If I were a Flower, which one would I be ? ” at the top. After reading Flower Garden by Eve Bunting or another book related to flowers, talk with the children about their favorite flower and have them illustrate it and dictate which flower they would be.

2. “Going on a Nature Walk”

Take the children on a nature walk on the playground or nearby park. Give each child a small clipboard made out of cardboard with a paper attached with binder clips. Have the children draw pictures of trees, plants, flowers and other “growing things” they see on their walk. Upon returning to the classroom, have the children tell you about their picture and take dictation about their picture. Bind the pages into a “Our Nature Walk” book.

3. “ABC Book about Plants!” Big Book

Ask your local carpet retailer if they'd be willing to donate any of the plastic handles that hold carpet samples. They are about 30" in length, which is a perfect size to hold large pieces of poster board (22" x 28") The handle becomes the "binder" of the book.

Give the children large pieces of paper to use as pages. Make the front and back covers out of poster board. Have the children draw pictures of things that grow – “A” Page – apples, avocados, aster; “B” Page – bananas, beets, etc.
